Your opportunity

An exciting opportunity exists for a dedicated and inspiring educator to join our team and help drive the future of Music across Year K - 6 in the College. As a member of a College that seeks to promote creativity you will help grow all aspects of our Music program and promote music participation and enjoyment. This role is well-suited for 3 or 4 days a week with the potential of a full-time position becoming possible by acquiring some general teaching duties across K-6.

Essential Criteria

Your suitability for the role will be assessed using the following criteria.

1. Personal Christian commitment, Church involvement and ability to teach with a Christian world view;
2. Demonstrate innovative practices that promote student participation in music and other areas of the creative arts;
3. Demonstrated ability to deliver a Primary music curriculum that is rich, differentiated and allows students to explore music through instruments and voice using current research and evidence;
4. Demonstrated ability to communicate effectively with students including the use of appropriate interpersonal skills, and the ability to apply classroom management strategies that contribute to the establishment and maintenance of a positive and supportive learning environment; and
5. A willingness to work collaboratively with parents, College staff and members of the wider community in order to establish and maintain productive partnerships to achieve educational outcomes.

Role, responsibilities and accountabilities

Your role as Teacher at Summerland Christian College include:

- Plan, prepare and deliver quality and effective teaching and learning programs which are consistent with the NESA Professional Standards for Teachers; and relevant syllabi, curriculum policies, work programs and educational trends;
- Deliver a Primary music curriculum that is rich, differentiated and allows students to explore music through instruments and voice.
- Foster an environment where all children are encouraged to explore the joy of music.
- Create a classroom environment to promote the cognitive, physical, emotional and social wellbeing of all students
- Inspire and encourage participation in music events and activities within and beyond the College.
- Innovate and develop opportunities to engage all musicians
- Maintain teaching competency and currency of knowledge of relevant curriculum programs as required by the College and other relevant statutory authorities;
- Provide for the physical, social, cultural and emotional wellbeing and physical safety of students whilst at the College and enhance their overall development towards effective citizenship and responsible adulthood through participation in timetabled, non-timetabled and planned extracurricular activities;

- Assess students (diagnostic, formative and summative) for developmental, feedback and reporting purposes;
- Maintain student records and samples of work and report on student performance to students, parents, the College Board and other stakeholders;
- Participate in the collaborative development and evaluation of curriculum (the sum total of all learning experiences) and regularly monitor, through observation and evaluation, the effectiveness of the learning/teaching program; and
- Participate as appropriate, in school decision making processes and professional development.
